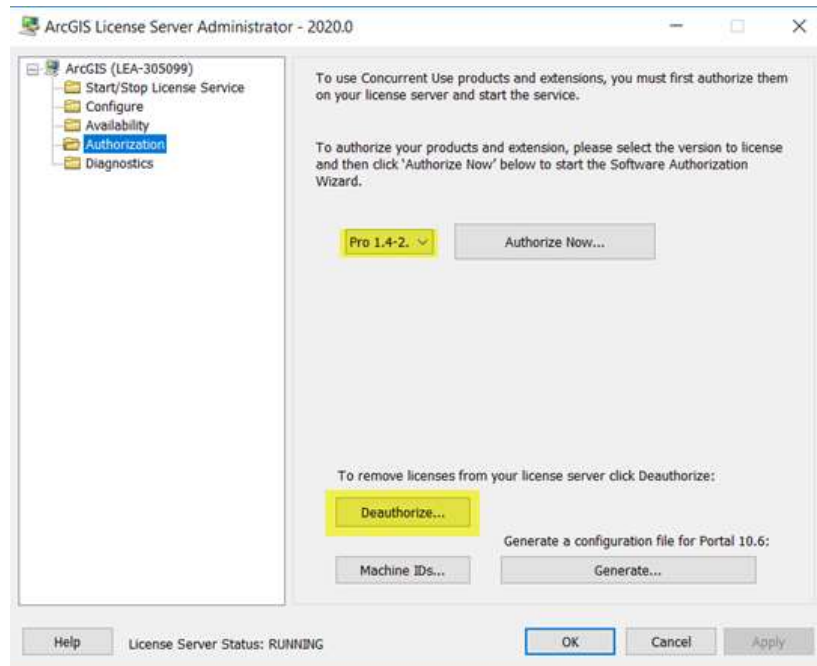


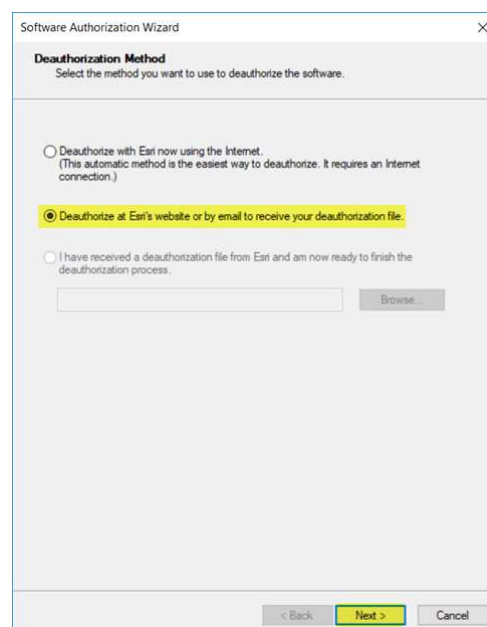


De-authorise ArcGIS Pro Concurrent Use Licenses Offline

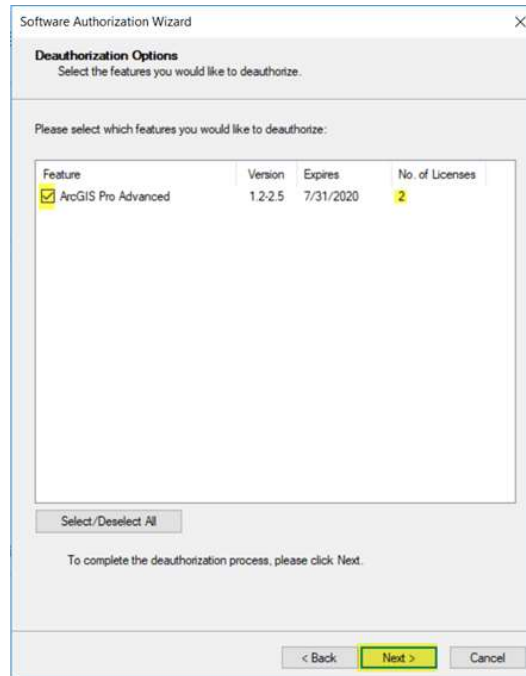
Open your ArcGIS License Server Administrator and ensure that any borrowed or checked out licenses are returned via the Availability folder. Then navigate to the Authorisation folder, select ArcGIS Pro 1.4 - 2.6 from the drop-down menu and then select the "De-authorise" button.



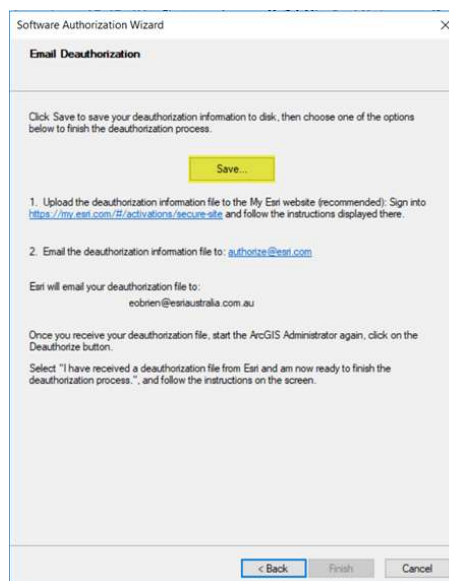
Select the option "De-authorise at Esri's website or by email to receive your de-authorisation file" from the panel outlined below, then click "Next".



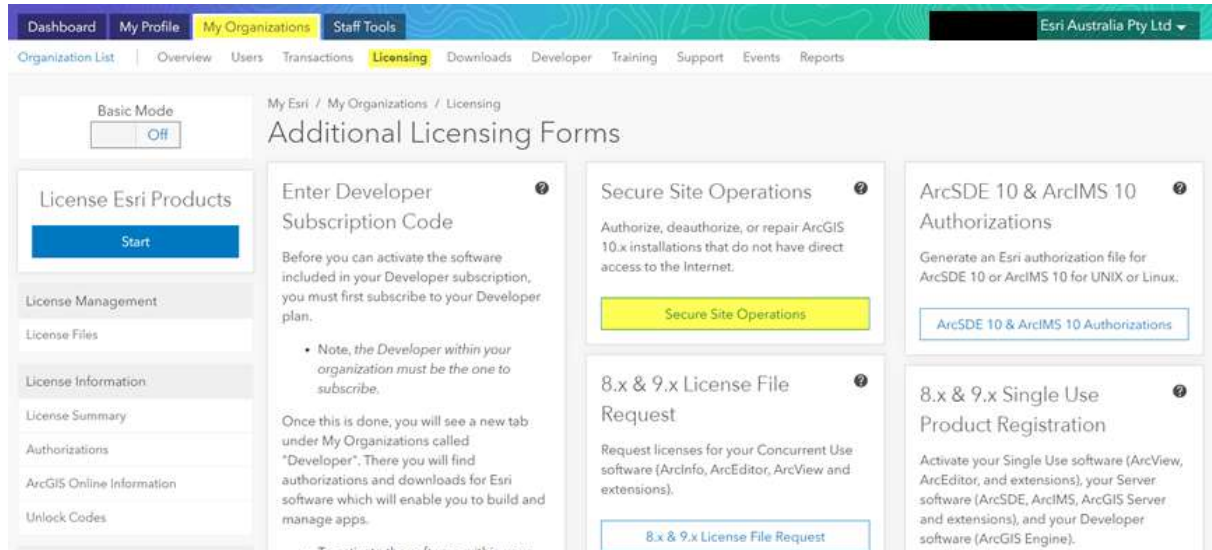
Select the feature that you wish to de-authorise and specify the number of licenses to be removed and then choose "Next".



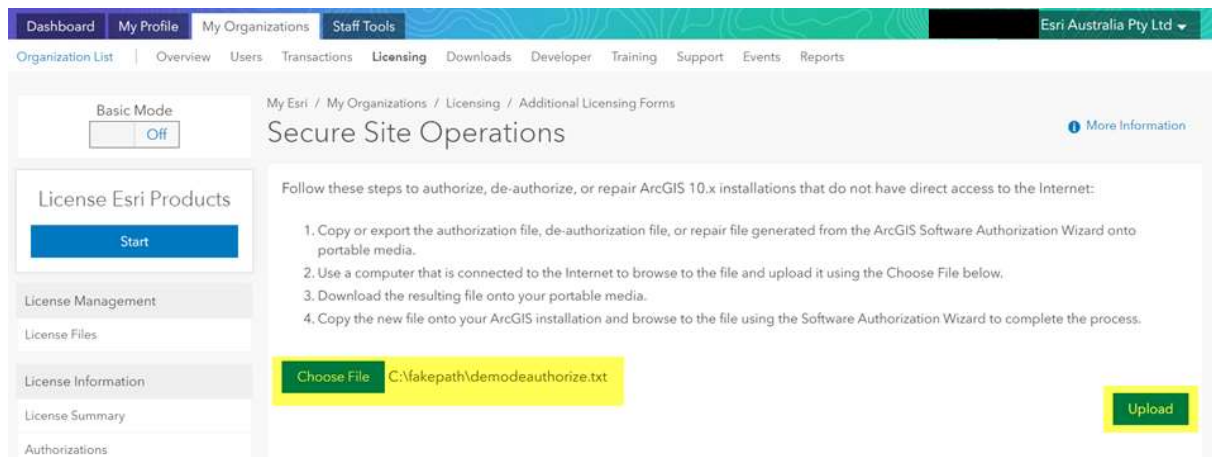
Click the "Save" button to produce a de-authorize.txt file and save to a location that you can easily browse to.



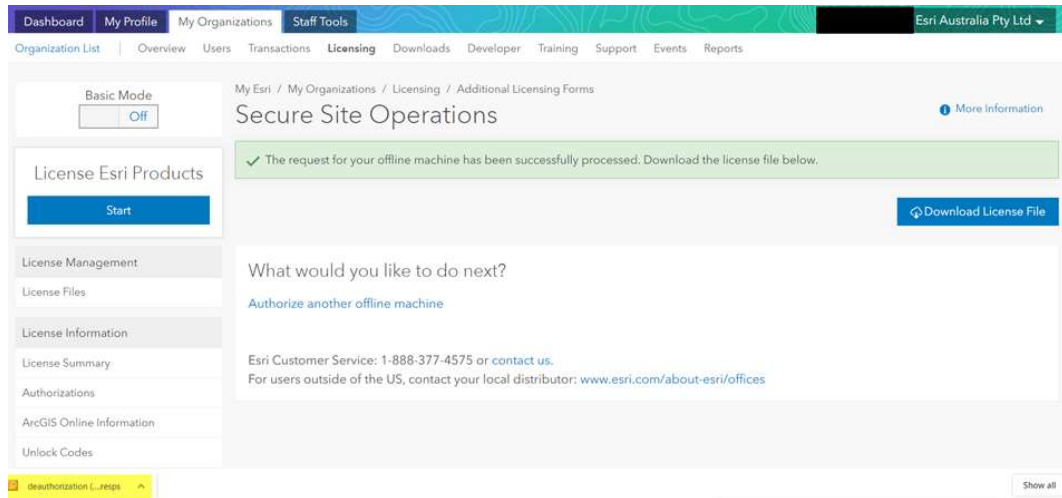
From an internet connected machine, log into My Esri (the account must have a minimum permission to take licensing actions). Navigate to My Organisation > Additional Licensing Forms > Secure Site Operations.



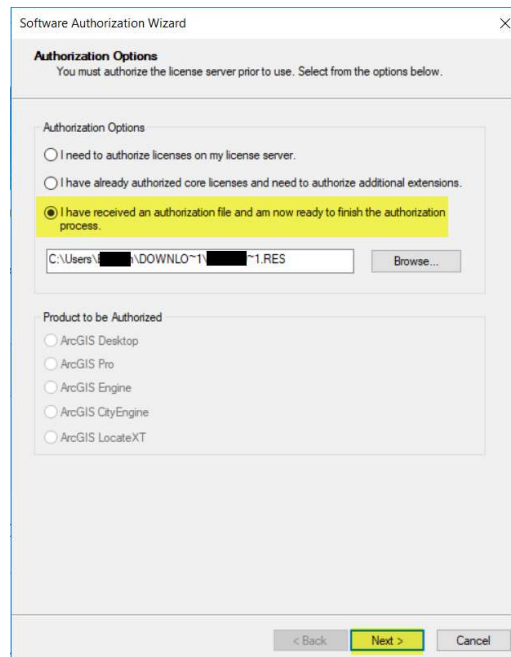
Using the "Choose File" button, browse to the de-authorize.txt that you created earlier and choose the "Upload" button.



Your secure de-authorisation file will download and will display at the bottom left hand side of your web browser. Click the file and allow to run and make changes to your machine where prompted.



You will be launched back into the software de-authorisation and your file automatically referenced. Click the "Next" button to proceed.



You will receive notification that the authorisation as completed and will list the features authorised.

Click the "Finish" button to re-read the licenses.
